

## Medical Form

Every camper needs to complete and bring an LLBC **Health History form every year** with current information. This form is enclosed. Bring this form with you to camp when you register; **do not mail it**. In the event that you lose the Health History form, you may find one on the camp's website [www.lakelundgrenbiblecamp.org](http://www.lakelundgrenbiblecamp.org).

**Medications:** All medications brought to camp (prescription & non-prescription) must be turned in to the Camp Health Supervisor at registration. Medications must be in properly marked containers with name of camper, name of medication, dosage, frequency and route of administration.

*Please do not send non-prescription medications or vitamins, unless necessary for your child. Camp has basic non-prescription medications on hand.*

You can be assured that the best possible care will be given to your child if a need arises. All medical expenses incurred are the responsibility of the camper's family. LLBC has excess medical insurance that will help beyond your own insurance coverage.

## Special Needs

Please contact camp if your camper has any special needs and/or any physical, emotional or mental health conditions that camp should be aware of prior to his or her arrival.

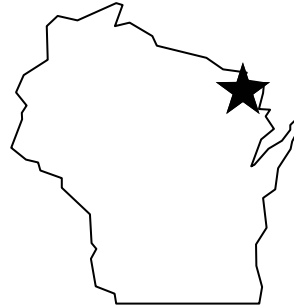


## Birthdays at Camp

LLBC is located in far northeastern Wisconsin off Highway 8, 2.5 miles west of Hwy. 141 in Pembine and 6 miles east of Dunbar. We are about an hour and a half north of Green Bay, and half an hour south of Iron Mountain, Michigan.

# Summer Camper Information Sheet

*We are looking forward to having your child attend Lake Lundgren Bible Camp. Please read this brochure very carefully as there is information that will help prepare you and your camper for a great week of camp.*

## Camper Arrival and Pickup

Summer camp registration is from 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm on Monday. Each camp ends after the noon meal, around 1:00 pm, on the following Saturday, except Junior Camp 1, which ends on Thursday, and Junior Camp 2 which begins on Tuesday and ends on Friday.

If special circumstances make it impossible for you to fit into this schedule, please make arrangements in advance with our office.

NOTE: No fee adjustments are made for late arrivals or early departures.

## Cancellations

If you need to cancel your registration, please notify us as soon as possible. Your courtesy may help another camper be able to attend. However, as indicated on our brochure, the registration fee is **not refundable or transferable**.



## Standby Information

If a camper's first and second choices of camp weeks are full, they will receive a notice or call that they have been placed on a standby list for both choices.

You will be notified as soon as possible when there is an opening. The registration deposit is refundable *if there is no opening*.

Please keep us posted if your plans change and you want to be removed from a camp week or from the standby list.

## Buddy Requests

Many campers come without a buddy and find they make new friends. A goal in cabin assignments is to provide a mixture of campers from different areas. This encourages campers to make new friends and discourages cliques.

Camp will make every effort to honor buddy requests. Those who have requested a buddy (who has also requested them) will be put with that buddy. No more than three buddies will be assigned to the same cabin, and all three must have listed *each other*. ***Please do not ask to have exceptions made.***

## Spending Money

Although it varies greatly, most campers bring between \$10 and \$25 as spending money. This can be used for crafts, missionary offering, the Canteen, or the Camp Store. The Canteen and Camp Store are open every day, including registration day and the closing day of camp for parents to shop. We recommend that campers turn their money in to the Camper Banking system on registration day. A mixture of one and five dollar bills is preferred.

## What to Bring:

Balance of Camp Fee (pre-payment is recommended for your convenience)



- Completed, current Health History form
- Clearly labeled medications. Please do not bring non-prescription medications.
- Bible, pencil, notebook
- Warm sleeping bag or bedding & pillow; towels & washcloths
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo & deodorant
- Warm jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt
- Modest camp clothing (\*see below)
- Flashlight, rain gear, insect repellent, sun-screen
- Spending money (one dollar bills preferred)
- Optional: camera, musical instrument, sports equipment (fishing, snorkeling gear, etc.)

\*Bring play clothes, sportswear, jeans, T-shirts, a modest swimsuit (one-piece for girls; boxer style for guys), and comfortable shoes. Modesty of dress is expected at camp. As there are often questions in this area, staff will make the final call on modesty. Please **do not** bring crop tops, halter tops, midriffs or clothing with spaghetti straps or without backs. Dresses and skirts must be at least 2" longer than your extended arms and fingers. Underclothes must be worn and must not show from under clothing.

Clearly label your belongings. We cannot be responsible for lost items, but if requested, we will look for and return items we find. You will be asked to cover postage on returned items.

## What Not to Bring:

**Please do NOT bring the following items:**

- fireworks, firearms, knives
- matches, lighters, cigarettes
- alcohol or non-prescription drugs
- radios, tape or CD players, walkmans, TVs, cell phones, MP-3 players, electronic games of any kind.
- candy, snacks or food (unless required for medical reasons)
- bikes, skateboards, roller blades
- pets
- valuables

## Mail

Please have family and friends put their return address on the envelope. They should address letters to campers as follows:

If there is a specific reason one must make a call home, it is our procedure to have a camp leader with the camper as they call. The leader will stay with the camper by the phone to answer any questions a parent may have. We ask that parents call only in case of emergency.
